Summer Greening and Feeding Field Day

On Wednesday 16th February, Kirsty attended the Summer Greening and Feeding field day which was held at the Gutha Community Hall (30kms North of Morawa). The field day began at 7am with a BBQ breakfast, cooked very well by Sarah Jeffery from NACC with the help of Kirsty from YYCMG and Kate Najar from NEFF (North East Farming Futures). There were approximately 30 farmers who came along to the field day and were treated to some great information from Dr Hayley Norman (CSIRO), Dr Helen Blake (DAFWA), Sarah Jeffery (NACC), Euan Beamont (Carbon diversity) and Mike Clarke (DAFWA). Dr Norman spoke with the group about the nutritional benefits of Saltbush for livestock, followed on by Dr Blake who spoke about the feeding of livestock during the summer months when normally there is not much feed growing. The main emphasis on the day was that between growing Fodder Shrubs (saltbush) and perennial pastures (panic grasses etc) that you would be able to feed your livestock very well throughout the drier months by rotating them on and off green feed and introducing hay and some forms of grain. Keep in mind however that too much green feed can sometimes do more damage than good.

After the guest speakers had discussed their information with the group we were taken to the property of Garry and Deb Collins who have planted perennial pastures, where we looked at their progress and were informed by Sarah (NACC) about the different types of perennials that can be grown, she also informed the farmers of the incentives available through NACC.

Yarra Yarra CMG to apply for funding to purchase Tree Planter for Region

The Yarra Yarra Catchment Management Group is Currently in the process of applying for a grant from the Department of Environment and Conservation through their **Environmental Community Grants 2011** program. The group has been investigating the different types of tree planters that are available and so far the best one looks like the Chatfield's Ezyplanter. We have acquired a quote from



Chatfield's in Tammin for one of their tree planters and the application process has

been started. The closing date for the application is Thursday 7th April 2011, we will know the outcome by the end of April.

Community Action Grant - Bush Corridors Project

This project is located in the Merkanooka catchment, just west of the Morawa town site. It will involve planting 40,000 trees on various properties alongside the existing deep drainage project. The valley floor has been fenced off and plantings will occur alongside the deep drain to enhance the area and provide revegetation in these previously saline areas.

Plantings will be undertaken with the Morawa High school and the Morawa Agricultural school students and also include local volunteer farmers.

By explaining the different species planted and the reasons why we have chosen them it is hoped to broaden the students awareness of plants and the biodiversity of the region. These young minds are agricultures future and we have a great opportunity to focus them on a greener outlook, perhaps!

Sandalwood Trial Site

The sandalwood project is coming along very well. Host species seedlings have been ordered from Kalannie Tree Nursery for planting at the trial site in June/July 2011. We hope to hold a trial site visit and workshop in September/October to see the success rate of the seedlings and to have someone from the Australian Sandalwood Network explain the benefits of Sandalwood plantations and what use the host species are to getting the plantation started.
